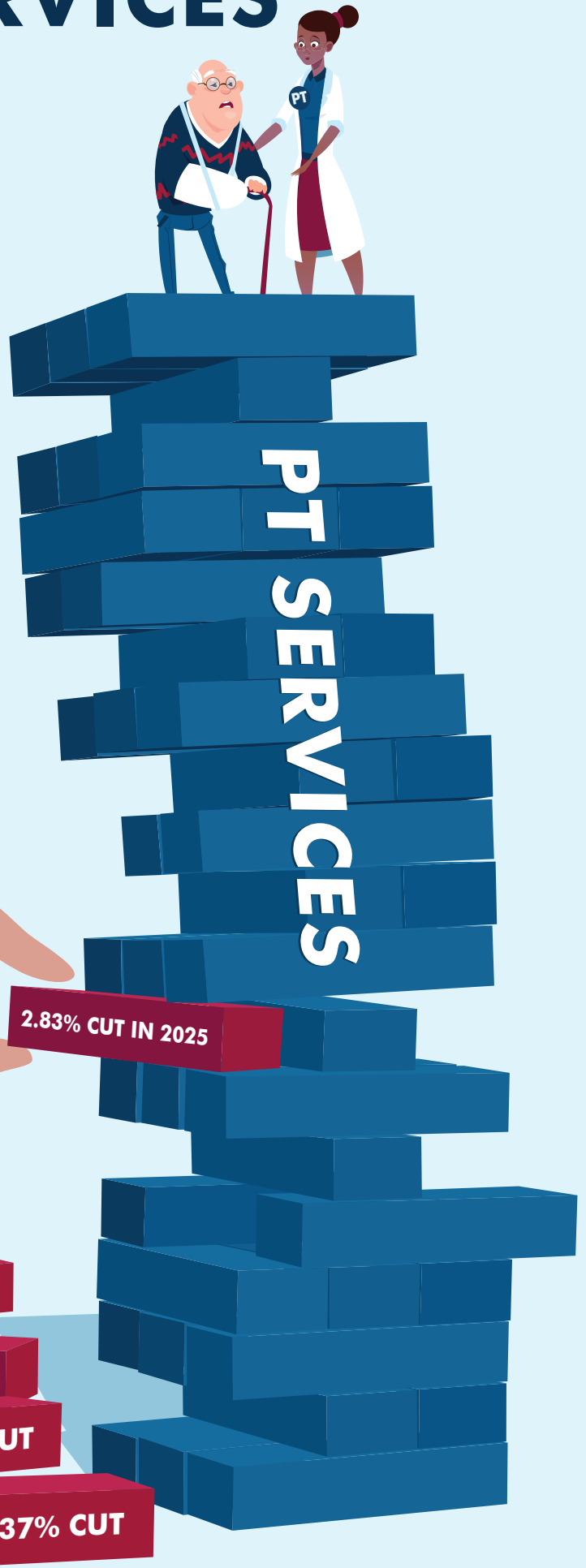


DEEP MEDICARE CUTS DESTABILIZE PHYSICAL THERAPY SERVICES

Annual rate cuts to the Medicare Physician Fee Schedule (MPFS) undermine patient access to physical therapy services. Starting January 1, 2025, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) implemented a -2.83% payment adjustment to providers paid under the MPFS, signaling the latest in a series of harmful payment cuts.

While Congress has mitigated the impact of MPFS cuts in recent years, these threats continue, building upon cuts made in previous years and further destabilizing practices nationwide.

As the United States continues to confront a series of health challenges, including the opioid crisis and the epidemic of elderly Americans falling in their homes, patient access to safe, professional physical therapy services must be protected.
